About the Hymns

The music of the psalter has long been a signature feature of Presbyterian and Reformed worship. In fact, Murray Presbyterian's original denomination—the United Presbyterian Church of North America—practiced what is called *exclusive psalmody* (where *only* psalms were allowed to be sung in worship) up until 1925. Rev. George Murray's Bible (which is now owned by our church) has the UPCNA's Psalter as section in the back.

Today's hymn following the sermon ("When in the Night I Meditate") is the Psalm 16 hymn from one of the classic psalters, published by John Day (or Daye) in London in 1562. Known as "the master printer of the English Reformation," Day published a wide variety of Protestant writings. That activity got him locked up in the Tower of London during the infamous reign of "Bloody Mary." But once Protestantism was restored, he again began producing Protestant literature, including Foxe's *Book of the Martyrs*. His 1562 psalter was the first one to set the English psalms to meter and it became the best-selling book of the day. It was widely used both in England and in North America up until the nineteenth century.

"Because He Lives," our final hymn today, is one of the most popular compositions by the husband-wife song-writing team of Bill and Gloria Gaither. Based on the words of Jesus in John 14:19—"because I live, you shall live also"—the lyrics stem from a crisis of faith they were going through around the time that their third child, Benjy, was born in 1971. At the time, they were facing health problems and other personal challenges. And with the chaos and uncertainty that seemed to be engulfing our society, they were distressed over the prospect of bringing another child into such a world. But on New Year's Eve, Gloria had a profound spiritual experience in which she felt the Lord imparting his peace and reassurance to her. "Gradually," she later recalled, "the fear left and the joy began to return. I knew I could have that baby and face the future with optimism and trust. It was the Resurrection affirming itself in our lives once again. It was LIFE conquering death in the regularity of my day." That realization became the inspiration for this beloved hymn.
