## **Reformation Sunday**

This morning, we join with Protestant Christians around the world in observing Reformation Sunday. This day marks the anniversary of the date (Oct. 31, 1517) when Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, Germany, sparking the movement that came to be known as the Protestant Reformation.

We open the service singing the majestic "battle hymn of the Reformation," Martin Luther's "A Mighty Fortress is Our God." Based on Psalm 46, this is the hymn most closely identified with the Reformation, and its opening words are inscribed on Martin Luther's tombstone. Our closing hymn, Keith Getty and Stuart Townsend's "In Christ Alone," echoes one of the Five Solas (Latin for "only")—the principles that were at the heart of the Reformation movement: Scripture Alone, Grace Alone, Faith Alone, Christ Alone, and Glory to God Alone.

As we mark this occasion, we recommit ourselves once again to upholding the biblical truths that came into sharper focus through the Reformation and to continuing the quest to become *Ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda*: "the Church Reformed, Always Reforming,

according to the Word of God and the call of the Spirit."
