About the Hymn

Our closing hymn this morning was chosen to mark the seventieth anniversary of an event that one scholar called the “defining missionary narrative for American evangelicals during the second half of the twentieth century.” On January 3, 1956, five young missionaries--Jim Elliot, Nate Saint, Roger Youderian, Pete Fleming, and Ed McCully—embarked on a quest to take the gospel to the Waoranis, an unreached, warlike tribal group in the Ecuadorian rain forest. The last thing they did before setting out was to gather for a time of worship. Jim Elliot’s wife, Elizabeth, described what happened: “At the close of their prayers the five men sang one of their favorite hymns, ‘We Rest on Thee,’ to the stirring tune of ‘Finlandia.’ Jim and Ed had sung this hymn since college days and knew the verses by heart. On the last verse their voices rang out with deep conviction. ‘We rest on Thee, our Shield and our Defender, Thine is the battle, Thine shall be the praise....’” Tragically, five days later they were killed by the Waoranis, becoming the most well-known missionary martyrs of the twentieth century. Their story is told in Elizabeth Elliot’s *Through Gates of Splendor* (which takes its title from a phrase in the hymn). It has also formed the basis for several films, including: “Through Gates of Splendor” (1967), “Beyond the Gates of Splendor” (2004) and “End of the Spear” (2006), all of which are available on various streaming platforms.
